¹ These pesticides are exempt from all Healthy Schools Act requirements, except the training requirement: 1) products used in self-contained baits or traps, 2) gels or pastes used as crack and crevice treatments, 3) antimicrobials, and 4) pesticides exempt from U.S. EPA registration. (Education Code Section 17610.5)

I. STATE LAW REQUIRES THAT YOU BE GIVEN THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION CAUTION: PESTICIDES ARE TOXIC CHEMICALS. Structural Pest Control Companies are licensed and regulated by the Structural Pest Control Board, and apply pesticides which are registered and approved for use by the California Department of Pesticide Regulation and the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Registration is granted when the state finds that based on existing scientific evidence, there are not appreciable risks if proper use conditions are followed or that the risks are outweighed by the benefits. The degree of risk depends upon the degree of exposure, so exposure should be minimized. If within 24 hours following application you should experience symptoms similar to common seasonal illness comparable to the flu, contact your physician or Poison Control Center (800) 222-1222 and your pest control operator immediately. The parties hereto voluntarily waive their rights to have such disputes litigated in a court, to jury trial, and to appeal.
